ServiceNSW has now released [the finer details](#) of eligibility for JobSaver, with applications opening Monday 26th July 2021 and closing midnight Monday 18th October 2021. JobSaver is designed to provide cashflow for NSW businesses to help maintain employee headcount. Eligible businesses with employees will receive fortnightly payments backdated to 18th July 2021 (week 4 of the Greater Sydney lockdown)

Services NSW Greater Sydney Lockdown Rules Jul 31st

Greater Sydney's lockdown has been extended until 12:01am Saturday 28 August.
