Shining a light on UNSW's self-healing 3D printed plastic

Research by UNSW academics shows that [special treatment](#) of liquid resin used in 3D printing can cause the material to mend itself if it becomes damaged. UNSW engineers have demonstrated a way to help 3D printed plastic heal itself at room temperature using only lights.

AFGC demands consistent, nationwide rules on Covid close contacts

[Nationally consistent rules](#) for managing Covid close contacts among essential workers are urgently needed, according to the Australian Food and Grocery Council (AFGC). The comments follow worsening staffing challenges for supermarkets and suppliers described by AFGC CEO Tanya Barden as the greatest since the start of the pandemic. Staff shortages are severely impacting producers, shippers and retailers, with many supermarket shelves in parts of NSW and Victoria, particularly, bereft of fresh food and essential supplies.

NUW Alliance to deliver a step change for manufacturing industry

Comprised of four Australian universities, the [NUW Alliance](#) has launched its vision for a research collaboration to be centred on the Western Sydney Aerotropolis at the Advanced Manufacturing Research Facility. Made up of Western Sydney University, UNSW Sydney, the University of Newcastle and the University of Wollongong, the NUW Alliance is partnering with the University of Technology Sydney to accelerate collaborative innovation for the Western Sydney Aerotropolis.

Businesses lose \$33bn to cyber criminals

The Australian Cyber Security Centre (ACSC) estimated that a cyber attack was deployed every eight minutes over the period. "Cyber crime is a \$33 billion people issue, and there is an increased sophistication of attacks exploiting the human link, including advanced ransomware crimes, internal staff being manipulated by threat actors, and cyber criminals exploiting gaps in critical systems," said Wayne Williamson, CISO, Equifax Australia & New Zealand.

Q-CTRL lands US grant for automated quantum tech

Sydney quantum pioneer Q-CTRL will significantly expand its presence in America thanks to a US government Small Business Innovation Research grant. Q-CTRL was this week awarded \$230,000 in funding through the US Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) for a project looking at "automated calibration, characterisation and optimisation of near-term quantum processors".

[Warning: USB Stick Gift as a ransomware exploit](#)

Hackers are currently sending [ransomware-infected USB Sticks](#) to businesses and individuals. Two approaches are being used to deliver these dangerous USB sticks: **1. Pretending to be Health workers or Humanitarian Service agencies** and **2. Amazon Appreciation Gift** In either case, the USB sticks contain a very dangerous ransomware exploit kit which triggers and takes over the affected device once the victim inserts it on his/her device.
