Supply chain and labour issues constrain industry expansion

The Ai Group Australian Performance of Manufacturing Index (Australian PMI) [increased](#) a further 2.5 points to 55.7 in March – the highest monthly result for the industry since July 2021. “The Australian manufacturing sector grew faster in March as manufacturers added new staff, lifted sales and continued to expand production (although at a slower pace than in February),” Ai Group chief executive Innes Willox said.

Mental Health Risk Management for Retailers

Mental illness is the [leading cause](#) of long-term sickness amongst Australian workers, with work-related mental illness costing \$543 million in workers' compensation claims per annum¹. It is widely reported that one in five people in Australia are living with a mental health condition².

Advanced manufacturing named priority area in rejigged research diplomacy fund

A \$60 million fund announced in last year's budget to support “strategically important science and technology collaborations” internationally features Advanced Manufacturing as a priority research area, with [the fund](#) also gaining a new “strategic element”. The Global Science and Technology Diplomacy Fund was introduced in

the 2021/2022 federal budget as a measure to consolidate international programs and focus on research themes identified as strategically important.

HSSO workforce development portal

The Human Services Skills Organisation (HSSO) has launched an [online portal](#) that gathers information about workforce development programs and initiatives in one place. It is designed to be used by employees, employers, organisations, registered training organisations (RTOs), educators, and peak bodies in human services as a

single point of reference to search and access content that is currently held in a multitude of locations.

More than one in 10 Windows users at risk

Avast's 2021 [Global PC Risk Report](#) analysed the threats that home and business Windows users encountered over the course of the past year, with Australian business users ranked 67th out of the 77 countries included in the report. On average, business users around the world had a 15.1% chance of encountering a threat, and in Australia, business users had a 12.78% chance of encountering a threat.

\$19 million in contracts awarded to companies developing tech for ADF use

A second round of contracts through the Defence Innovation Hub this week has been [announced](#), with nine companies awarded \$19 million on Thursday to develop new technologies for use by the Australian Defence Force. Among winners were: • RUAG Australia, awarded \$2.43 million to continue development of metal additive manufacturing techniques to repair components, • robotic manipulator company Blueprint Lab, which earned \$1.04 million to develop a remotely-operated system for performing underwater tasks.
