Legally speaking: very few Australian employees have the right to WFH

Before the pandemic, working from home was a luxury. Then it became a necessity. Since lockdowns have eased it has become a contested space between what employers and workers want. Now unions – including the Financial Services Union, National Tertiary Education Union (of which I am a national councillor) and the Media, Entertainment and Arts Alliance – are pushing to enshrine working from home as a right.

30 years on, we still haven't got industry policy we need

A week or so from now, 30 years ago a young warrior for manufacturing industry Dr Roy Green had this article (pictured) printed in the Canberra Times outlining the case for a national industry policy. Australia was then just emerging from a 'sheltered workshop' era of manufacturing as the then Labor government unwound protection sometimes exceeding 200 percent that had created a derivative, technologically laggard manufacturing sector.

Heart Research Institute: Regaining fitness after COVID infection can be hard

Are you finding it difficult to get moving after having COVID? You are not alone. Even if you have mild symptoms, you may still experience difficulty in regaining your fitness. Building back up to exercise is important, but so is taking it slowly. In general, most people can start to return to exercise or sporting activity after experiencing no symptoms for at least seven days. If you still have symptoms two weeks post-diagnosis, you should seek medical advice.

Promoting collaboration between design and engineering teams

Design in construction projects is the early stage of a project that is critical to accurate budgeting and planning, and [workflow collaboration](#) is essential. [Research](#) indicates that compared to other units, the design team operates in a somewhat siloed environment where their toolsets and processes are less integrated into overall project management. This barrier between the design and engineering teams needs to be addressed as the design process creates a solution to a project brief and prepares instructions allowing that solution to be constructed

Ltd to market and sell its products within the People's Republic. Kontour is listed on the Shanghai stock exchange and is a leading manufacturer and distributor of surgical supplies across mainland China

Australian team develops more durable antiviral PPE coatings through R&D project

A ten-month R&D project nearing completion is about to improve the durability and performance of [antiviral coatings](#) for Australian made facemasks and other PPE items, according to those behind it. The project between coating technology specialist Xefco, Deakin University and the Innovative Manufacturing CRC had improved the durability of "of already-developed antiviral and heat-reflective metallic coatings" according to the IMCRC.
