Addressing the skills crisis requires collaboration, Forum reveals

On 17 August, IBSA's Manufacturing Skills Forum brought manufacturers, union leaders, peak bodies and training providers together to share strategies to address the skills crisis. The Forum highlighted the need for a collaborative and systematic approach, with government and industry working together to seize the opportunities that lie ahead. "As a government, it is imperative that we more precisely identify and supply the skills that are in demand now and in the future," minister for Skills and Training Brendan O'Connor said.

Husic calls for R&D lift to 3% of GDP - report

Federal industry minister Ed Husic has talked of a <u>new goal</u> of raising Australia's R&D spending 'towards three percent of GDP'. According to a report in Campus Morning Mail, Husic told an audience at UTS, Sydney on Thursday that the goal should be to raise spending from today's 1.79 percent of GDP which covers government and industry research.

A proven framework for manufacturing innovation
