## University of Sydney announces quantum computing chip foundry

The University of Sydney today announced a \$7.4 million investment to expand its quantum technology facilities to establish the <u>Future Qubit Foundry</u> at the Sydney Nanoscience Hub.The foundry will be a national-leading facility to invent the technology of tomorrow's quantum computers, enabling them to operate at scale and be of use to society.

#### Ai Group to steer digital transformation tool for SMEs

The Australian Industry Group (Ai Group) has been selected as the ongoing custodian of <u>futuremap</u> – a diagnostic platform developed by the <u>IMCRC</u> to help SMEs embrace digital transformation. The Innovative Manufacturing Cooperative Research Centre (IMCRC), an independent, government-funded organisation with a fixed lifespan, closed its doors at the end of <u>January</u>. However, the value of futuremap for Australian manufacturing saw IMCRC launch a search for a new long-term custodian late last year.

#### **NSW Government boosts Construction Compliance Unit**

The NSW Government is boosting funding to the NSW Construction Compliance Unit in a bid to strengthen industrial relations and procurement oversight for state projects. The move aims to protect the state's 400,000 construction jobs and \$116.6 billion infrastructure pipeline. The NSW Government's latest measures include boosting funding to the NSW Construction Compliance Unit (CCU) by \$1.3 million a year for proactive monitoring, reporting and compliance activities; increasing unannounced site visits on NSW Government-funded infrastructure projects by the CCU.

#### **Construction trends for 2023**

We see a few trends that will continue to challenge the construction industry for the

best part of 2023; and whilst there are some headwinds, there are also some great positives and silver linings on the horizon. The supply chain issues of 2022 appear to be minimising. Global factors such as normalised supply and demand, oil and gas pricing off their highs, the US dollar closer to normal levels and the reopening of China, all suggest a more orderly supply of products in cross trade globally. The Ukraine situation, whilst far from over, is at least at a point where the rest of the world has recalibrated and negotiated their supply chains to accommodate for it. #### The potential of cancer therapy with 4D printing

Despite the fact that <u>3D printing</u> technology has been widely used in medical applications due to the benefits of precisely defined architecture and individual constructs, there are still challenges, such as scalability and static structures that cannot change over time or adapt to dynamic environments. <u>Thus, 4D printing has emerged</u> to address these challenges and play a significant role in the innovative fabrication of dynamic constructs.
