The Federal Budget delivered on Tuesday 9 May 2023 included welcome funding to establish the National Construction Industry Forum (NCIF). Australian Constructors

Association CEO Jon Davies said the NCIF will provide a tripartite forum to transform the construction industry, as other sectors have, so we can emerge as a worldwide leader and industry of choice for future generations of workers

Celebrating Australian Made – towards green Australian supply chains by John Noonan

Europe introduces a carbon border tax in 2026, but will steel users have to pay a premium for green steel? Not if Australia's experiment with greening the steel manufacturing supply chain is successful. Australia is investing heavily in a 100 percent <u>Distributed Variable Renewable Energy and Storage</u> (DVRES) electricity grid allowing the development of the green iron ore mining and green steel production that will underpin a critical sovereign industrial green manufacturing supply chain

Many employers find it hard to recruit people with the skills they need

Australia's Skilled Migration Program is designed to attract migrants who make a significant contribution to the Australian economy, and fill positions where no Australian workers are available. While the program has the potential to assist small businesses, a recent NSW <u>Small Business Commission survey</u> found that over half of businesses that considered sponsoring a skilled migrant didn't know where to start or found the process confusing.

Husic updates national interest Critical Technologies list

Industry and Science minister Ed Husic has released a refreshed 2023 '<u>List of Critical Technologies</u>' identifying seven key areas of national interest, after a review found the need for a catalogue with greater focus and purpose. Mr Husic unveiled the updated list on Friday morning, just days after the government stumped up \$100-odd million for a new critical technologies package in the federal Budget.
