Simulation-based training approach for construction equipment operators

Bestech Australia delivers <u>heavy equipment simulators</u> for the construction industry. The productivity of construction field equipment, such as cranes, loaders and excavators, is directly affected by the ability of the operator. The gaps in ability present in a typical workforce, where operators with lower proficiency are likely to be responsible for most incidents. Any accident imposes additional repairs and wears the equipment quicker, increasing overall maintenance and operational costs.

Research on future 3D printing of human tissues

A team of bioengineers and biomedical scientists from the <u>University of Sydney</u> and the Children's Medical Research Institute (CMRI) at Westmead have used <u>3D</u> <u>photolithographic</u> printing to create a complex environment for assembling tissue that mimics the architecture of an organ.

Consumers rethink diet as cost pressures increase

Rising cost-of-living pressures have taken a toll on the Australian diet, according to research commissioned by food tracking app MyFitnessPal. The findings have revealed that Australians are "overwhelmingly" turning to cheaper alternatives to increase their protein

Budding entrepreneurs will have the chance to take their startup ideas to the next level with applications now open for <u>four pre-accelerator programs</u> aimed at supporting founders from diverse backgrounds, and increasing the number of social impact startups entering the market. The programs launch will support underrepresented groups in the innovation ecosystem, including women and people with diverse backgrounds, and will be delivered by Startmate, I2N (University of Newcastle), iAccelerate (University of Wollongong) and UNSW Founders (University of NSW)
