CRC Projects selection round 15 outcomes

The Federal Government is investing \$51 million in 21 new Cooperative Research Centres Projects (CRC-P through Round 15 of the <u>CRC-P program</u>. Large-scale solar panel recycling, miniature digital probes for endomicroscopy examinations, and a prototype electric aircraft for firefighting. Slowing business activity means Aussies will find it harder to land a job in coming months

In short: Australia's job market has turned the corner, according to leading economists, who point to slowing business activity in addition to an uptick in the unemployment rate. • The Business Council says <u>business conditions must be addressed</u>, while the treasurer says the slowdown is an inevitable consequence of rising rates, persistent inflation and global uncertainty.

Soft plastic recycling is back after the REDcycle collapse – but only in 12 supermarkets. Will it work this time?

After the memorable collapse of Australia's largest soft plastic recycling program

REDcycle in late 2022, a <u>new scheme</u> is emerging. It's remarkably similar, albeit on a much smaller scale. The trial underway in <u>12 Melbourne supermarkets</u> intends, once again, to provide customers with an in-store option for recycling "scrunchable" food packaging.

Award Variation would reap major benefits for Employers

The proposal is aimed at addressing the <u>ongoing issue</u> of employers paying 'middle managerial' employee salaries without keeping records of their time and attendance. This lack of record-keeping poses increasing risks for businesses, especially with fines increasing to \$469,500 per breach or \$4,695,000 for "serious contraventions" regarding overtime records.
