### Small recycler develops answer to behind-the-scenes powder problem

Brad Scott uses the word "serendipity" to describe the progress of his plastic recycling business. In a few years it has gone from a hobby to developing what he says is a <u>world first solution</u> to a significant industrial waste problem. Scott says powder coating is a problem estimated to represent about 800,000 tonnes a year of waste going into landfill, and despite Dulux's best efforts it hadn't identified an answer.

#### Micro-X demonstrates micro-CT and passenger X-ray scanners

Cold cathode X-ray manufacturer Micro-X has demonstrated the micro-CT scanner for detecting strokes at the point of care, and passenger baggage scanner it is developing for the US Department of Homeland Security under a US\$14 million contract. The Adelaide company said delivery of the first fully functional prototype of the CT baggage scanner from its Seattle office, where it is undergoing final checks, to Homeland Security was 'imminent'

### BlueScope to invest \$1.15 billion, retain sovereign steelmaking

The Chief Executive Australian Steel Products, BlueScope Steel Tania Archibald has confirmed BlueScope will invest \$1.15 billion to reline and upgrade its idled No. 6 Blast Furnace at Port Kembla. However at a media conference with Climate Change and Energy minister Chris Bowen, Archibald said the company remained committed to achieving net zero by 2050. She said: "But we can't lose our sovereign steel-making capability in the process.
