DEWR Publishes VET Workforce Blueprint

The VET <u>Workforce Blueprint</u> has been developed in collaboration with states and territories to provide a roadmap to grow, support and sustain the VET workforce. It has been informed by consultations with stakeholders and expert advice from the VET Workforce Blueprint Steering Group.

Shoppers Face A Growing Risk From Cybercrime And Retailers Must Do More Every time a shopper uses a credit card, debit card, digital wallet or other non-cash payment method – that's some 80% of purchases, according to BankRate – they are entrusting retailers with vital personal data and making themselves vulnerable to cybercrime. News recently broke that a gap in Adobe Commerce and Magento software resulted in the breach of customer data from over 4,000 online merchants – some 5% of their supported online stores.
